## CONTRIBUTORS AND REVIEWERS

SALVADOR ARANETA was voted Farmer-of-the-year at the end of 1952. He is Vice-President of the Araneta Institute of Agriculture, and formerly was a member of the Cabinet with the portfolio of Economic Coordinator.
